



**Faculty Position in Health Care Delivery and Effectiveness Research  
Department of Population Medicine,  
Harvard Medical School and  
Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Institute**

The Department of Population Medicine, Harvard Medical School and Harvard Pilgrim Health Care is seeking a faculty member to develop a new program in Health Care Delivery and Effectiveness Research. This position is intended for a full-time assistant or associate professor.

The new faculty member will develop and lead a portfolio of research based in the Department. The portfolio includes both comparative effectiveness and delivery science research. The Department is interested in supporting the growth of these types of research and the new faculty member will have an active role in shaping the Department's agenda in these areas; in addition to conducting independent and collaborative research based on external grant funding. The faculty member will practice clinically within Atrius Health, an integrated physician group network, and will participate in the Department's teaching activities, which involve fellows, primary care residents, graduate students, and medical students.

The Department is very well-positioned as an appointing department of Harvard Medical School. It is located in the Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Institute, and receives support from Harvard Pilgrim Health Care, a large, non-profit health plan. It is also the home of an AHRQ DEcIDE (Developing Evidence to Inform Decisions about Effectiveness) Center.

An important component of this position will be the opportunity to conduct health care delivery and effectiveness studies in real-life populations by collaborating between the Department and Atrius Health. Atrius Health is an alliance of five leading medical groups in eastern Massachusetts that care for over 700,000 patients. The research and teaching of both organizations are aimed at improving population health and health care delivery, and these organizations have a long history of successful research collaborations. This position will offer direct interactions with the clinical leadership of Atrius Health to shape a collaborative research agenda.

Ideal candidates for this position will have an MD degree, plus either an MPH or a doctoral degree in epidemiology, health policy, economics, or a related field. They will also have a strong record of externally supported research projects and peer-reviewed publications.

The Department offers a supportive and collaborative environment, and actively encourages applications from women and minorities.
